

Membership Criteria (updated 2015)

For an organisation to become part of the Early Childhood Forum it must meet the following criteria.

- Member organisations of ECF must work wholly or in part for children from pre-birth to seven and have a policy, practice or research function.
- Member organisations are ones that represent specific aspects/issues/concerns of the early childhood sector nationally.
- Member organisations should have a policy for equality and anti-discriminatory practice.
- All member representatives must represent the full views of their organisation and agree to report back to the organisation which they represent on the Forum.
- Every member organisation must empower their representative to contribute fully to the work of the Forum and when requested and whenever possible, respond to relevant documents.
- In order to remain in membership of ECF, organisations must normally be represented at least once out of three meetings during the calendar year.
- If a substitute member is to attend a meeting the Chair must be notified in advance.

Observer status is offered to Government department and nondepartmental public bodies. Observers are invited to attend ECF meetings to update members on current policy and activities and provide a two-way dialogue. They have no voting rights and cannot hold Chair or Steering Group posts.
